At its regular meeting on July 15-16, 2004, the South Dakota Board of Nursing considered your request for the closure of probation on your nursing license. After reviewing the materials received throughout your probationary period and the discharge summary, the Board of Nursing determined that you successfully completed your period of monitoring by the South Dakota Health Professionals Assistance Program and active nursing practice on probation. Hence, the Board unanimously voted to grant the closure of your probation.

You should have received a new renewal certificate (your wallet card) following the meeting. If not, please contact the Board office.

Please be advised that having your license on "Probation" constitutes formal disciplinary action on your nursing license. You are required to answer "yes" to any questions, on the renewal application or any other licensure or employment applications, regarding a past history of having receiving disciplinary action by the Board of Nursing. Failure to answer "yes" to this type of question on any future application for licensure renewal will be considered a falsified application and will be reported to the Board of Nursing. Specifically, you must answer "yes" to the following question:

Has your license or certification in any state or Canadian province been denied, revoked, suspended, stipulated, placed on probation or otherwise subjected to any type of disciplinary action?
