MINUTES of the September 15-16, 2009 Board Meeting were approved, with the addition under NCSBN that "G. Damgaard was elected as a member at large of the Executive Committee". Minutes of the September 2009 Joint Board Meeting were approved in a unanimous voice vote, and have been approved by the Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners as presented.

AGENDA, with the addition of "Just Culture" under 8b), and cancellation of 9j) was approved.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Senior Accountant R. Garrigan presented based on the written budget reports. The Financial Report was approved in a unanimous voice vote. LPN student loan applications have been fewer than anticipated, and so each applicant could be awarded \$1000 rather than the \$500 as in the past. John Jones made the MOTION that LPN student loan applicants be awarded \$1000 each; seconded by Teresa Disburg; carried in a unanimous voice vote.

NCLEX 3RD QUARTER REPORT: N. Bohr presented based on handouts previously distributed. The pass rates for South Dakota compare favorably with national rates for both LPN and RN candidates.

CNA 3RD QUARTER REPORT: N. Bohr briefly reviewed the written report. Two CNA training programs lost their approval status based on DOH reports, but are given an opportunity to rectify issues.

LEADERSHIP AND LEGISLATION CONFERENCE: G. Damgaard reported that she and L. Young attended the NCSBN conference which centered on the leadership of Abraham Lincoln. Speakers from the Illinois state government discussed various topics, including legislation involving lay midwives. L. Young added that information regarding the submitting of legislative proposals was shared.

NCSBN LEADERSHIP SUCCESSION COMMITTEE: N. Bohr, now in her second year as a member of this committee, reported that the Leadership Development Plan is the focus of their work. Qualified candidates are sought for leadership within NCSBN. The group will meet again in January 2010 to review progress and discuss more possible ideas and approaches to meeting the goals.

SOUTH DAKOTA HEALTH CARE FRAUD TASK FORCE: G. Damgaard and K. Rausch attended yesterday, along with representatives from other large state licensing Boards and law enforcement agencies, as well as the U. S. Attorney. Fraud involving durable medical equipment has recently become prevalent; two incidents have arisen in South Dakota.

ENVIRONMENTAL SCAN: This was provided as an informational piece.

NCSBN POLICY PERSPECTIVES: G. Damgaard pointed out highlights, such as regulation of proprietary nursing education schools, and the item regarding the framework of crisis management care.

LA TIMES ARTICLE – California Board of Nursing: This was provided as an informational piece.

FLORIDA NURSE ACCUSED OF REUSING EQUIPMENT – CNN: This article regarding the reuse of cardiac stress testing equipment was shared with the Board.

NNAAP AND MACE UPDATES & CERTIFIED MEDICATION ASSISTANT PROGRAM & WE CARE ONLINE: N. Bohr presented based on results of the IRE survey project that she conducted this year. An online course for Certified Medication Assistants has been developed, with clinicals conducted at the healthcare facility. A national test will be implemented January 2010 for medication assistants. G. Damgaard noted that a voluntary registry in South Dakota could be developed for Medication Assistants, both certified and non-certified; such a registry could be of benefit to employers as well as to registrants. Costs for taking the course and the test will be reviewed, as well as the cost of developing and implementing a registry database. Anticipating that unlicensed assistive personnel will be more widely utilized in the healthcare field, and that they will be relied upon to have a stronger skill set, development of the registry would be a proactive step. Statutory ramifications and disciplinary authority must be addressed.

MOTION: L. Bunkers moved that the South Dakota Board of Nursing direct Board staff to proceed with the development of voluntary certification of Medication Aides and a registry that would include both (MA-C) certified and non-certified Medication Aides (MA).
Seconded by P. Wagner. Motion carried in a unanimous voice vote.

SINTE GLESKA UNIVERSITY – Hearing for Change of Approval Status. Deb Soholt, President of the Board, announced that this is the time and place for Hearing the matter involving Sinte Gleska University Nursing Education Program's approval status. Sinte Gleska University representatives Cheryl Madearis, Georgia Hackett, and Jim Poignee were present to address the Board. Kristine O'Connell, Board Attorney, presented background. Site visits conducted in 2008 were conducted by Board member June Larson and Nancy Bohr, Nursing Program Specialist. The Practical Nursing Program was placed on Probation in September 2008. Some items that were found to be at issue have been resolved by the Program. Exhibits 1-11 were submitted by the Board of Nursing and Exhibits 12-17 by Sinte Gleska University.

- J. Poignee said that an applicant for Program Director has interviewed with the Program, was offered the position, but due to complications with an education loan repayment requirement that she provide care at Indian Health Services, is unable to take the position yet.
- C. Madearis said that they had been advertising since the former director left the program, but have not received applications from any other qualified candidates. Currently, there are two full-time and one three-quarter time faculty members; one holds an ADN, one is enrolled in a BSN to Masters Program, and the other is enrolled in a diploma to BSN program. There are currently 64 students officially enrolled in the nursing program; 19 students are enrolled in nursing classes, but have not declared a nursing major.

- C. Madearis said that a great deal of time has been devoted to developing philosophy of assessment for the institution as a whole as well as department by department. Students do assessments, and recommendations are made to the department chair based on the data generated.

Exhibit 15: Sinte Gleska's explanation to its departments regarding expectations and assessments; this was implemented this fall, and includes a timeline, changes, and who is responsible. Instructor surveys regarding these matters are expected at the end of this semester.

Exhibit 16: J. Poignee introduced other pertinent documents.

- J. Poignee said that the nursing program has full control of the budget allocated to it. G. Hackett said that, as seen in Exhibit 9, the Program Director had control of the portion of the funding

from Sinte Gleska University. J. Poignee added that the Director of the Nursing Program would assign faculty workload.

Sinte Gleska representatives said that they are addressing concerns regarding governance, such as nursing faculty meetings and minutes being kept. They are also exploring options to fill the Director position on an interim basis until a full time Director is in place; they have a memorandum of understanding with SDSU about staff if they need help.

G. Damgaard noted that at least an Interim Director must be in place to maintain approval status, according to Board rules.

Exhibit 17: A fax requested by C. Hackett via telephone from her staff outlining budgetary items, was received and was introduced as Exhibit 17.

An Interim Program Director approved by the Board of Nursing must be in place by the beginning of Spring 2010 Semester or approval will be withdrawn.

CNW REPORT OF ACTIVITIES AND SCHOOL HEALTH TECHNOLOGY AND JUST CULTURE - GENERATIVE DISCUSSION:

L. Young shared that grant opportunities will be explored to help cover expenses to have David Marx, author of Whack-A-Mole, speak at a conference. Accountability, personal choices, and punishment based on behavior rather than outcome were discussed; several anecdotal examples were recounted. On October 28, 2009, CNW met to discuss diabetes and insulin administration in the schools; a grant is being pursued to help with related expenses in the schools. Innovative programs are in place in some schools; it is highly unlikely that there will ever be sufficient funds available to have a nurse in every school. L. Bunkers remarked that cooperative telehealth systems are in place between some hospitals and schools.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG MONITORING PROGRAM SUBCOMMITTEE: G. Damgaard reported that at its most recent meeting, there was unanimous support for implementation of the program, but there is still some discussion regarding its structure.

ANNUAL MEETING OF SOUTH DAKOTA HEALTH RELATED LICENSING BOARDS: G. Damgaard and L. Young attended; much of the discussion centered on conflict of interest issues. The state epidemiologist spoke on H1N1 flu.

NLCA UPDATE: G. Damgaard was elected as Director at Large of the NLCA Executive Committee. On June 1, 2010, Missouri will become the 24th member of the Nurse Licensure Compact.

CORE BEST PRACTICES CONFERENCE: September 2009, G. Damgaard attended the conference in Chicago. The top ten boards were represented. Best practices regarding discipline, including autonomy of the Board, staffing, investigator background, administrative support, and tracking systems were discussed.

SOUTH DAKOTA CORRECTIONAL HEALTH CLINICAL ENRICHMENT PROGRAM – Request for Approval: N. Bohr reported that this program would be implemented in the seven correctional facilities throughout South Dakota. It would be run like other programs, with preceptors and RN supervision.

NATIONAL AMERICAN UNIVERSITY – Request for Prerequisite Status Generic BSN Program: N. Bohr presented. Mary Ann Fanning, Dr. Julia Bronner, and Dr. Sean Kerr were present to address the Board. Dr. Bronner reviewed the documents that NAU had previously provided, and commented that the NAU chairs are all committed to nursing, and all doctorally prepared. The generic BSN is the current focus; curriculum includes some nursing background courses as well as clinicals at the end; M. Fanning will be the chair. The curriculum is innovative and each student works with a counselor. A satellite system will be used for some online courses. An agreement with Rapid City Regional Hospital is in place in the west river area for clinicals. NAU programs that are already active show impressive success rates for students. A mentor will be available for Sioux Falls students.

FOREIGN EDUCATED NURSES LICENSURE BY EXAMINATION – Policy Revision: N. Some states, such as California, require CGFNS certification prior to licensure, but do not require it prior to sitting for the NCLEX. Legal counsel will investigate whether this Board has statutory authority to require the SSN.

CHAIR OF USD NURSING PROGRAM Appointment: J. Larson shared that the newly appointed Chair is a great fit for the position. USD is planning to implement a Bachelors of Science in Nursing program, pending Board of Regents approval.
