The South Dakota Board of Nursing office is in receipt of your application to renew your LPN license. The application contains a series of disciplinary questions. You answered, "no" to the question: "Has your license or certification in any state or Canadian province been denied, revoked, suspended, stipulated, placed on probation or otherwise subjected to any type of disciplinary action?"

Our records indicate that on February 3, 2000 your license was placed on "Probation" for until you successfully completed the Health Professionals Assistance Program. Please be advised that having your license on "Probation" constitutes formal disciplinary action on your nursing license. You are required to answer "yes" to any questions, on the renewal application or any other licensure and employment applications, regarding a past history of having received disciplinary action by a Board of Nursing. Be further advised that your failure to answer "yes" to this type of question on any future application for licensure renewal will be considered a falsified application and will be reported to the Board of Nursing.

Your file was presented to the Board on September 18, 2003 along with a request to close the probationary monitoring period based on notification from the Health Professionals Assistance Program that you successfully completed that program in December 2002. The Board voted unanimously to close the probation on your LPN license.

However, in the future you must answer yes to the question: Has your license or certification in any state or Canadian province been denied, revoked, suspended, stipulated, placed on probation or otherwise subjected to any type of disciplinary action?
