### **Telemedicine In Motion**

Telemedicine in Motion continues to be one of my most favorite initiatives. Through our partnership with Avel eCare, we are leading transformative efforts in South Dakota and setting a trajectory for the future of EMS across



the country. This has been such a humbling initiative to be part of. As of this writing, we have over 69 sites live, there have been over 612 patient encounters, and 92 agreement contracts have been signed. Each week, we continue to see growth, renewed excitement around EMS, and technology enhancement opportunities.

In September, we were able to present Telemedicine in Motion to the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Emergency Medicine in Rural and Indigenous Communities (emRIC) Conference in Rapid City. This was such an enjoyable experience to share the impact of Telemedicine with Rural and Indigenous Community healthcare leaders.

Our LIFEPAK initiative has almost been fully realized with the delivery of 284 devices across South Dakota.

We are working with a few services to secure devices for them presently with the aim of having 306 devices distributed by years end.

## Michael Glynn Memorial Coalition Lifesaving Impact By South Dakota Department of Health

### Michael Glynn Memorial Coalition Lifesaving Impact on White River High School

In a rural, frontier community, the Michael Glynn Memorial Coalition (MGMC) saw a pressing need for cardiac emergency response. Partnering with the Sanford Training Center, they provided American Red Cross CPR and First Aid Training to 40 students at White River High School.

MGMC didn't stop at physical health; they recognized the importance of mental well-being. They offered Teen Mental Health First Aid Training to 10th-12th graders and introduced the Hope Squad, a peer-to-peer suicide prevention program, for grades 4-9.

The results were remarkable. 40 newly trained students became potential lifesavers. The mental health initiatives created a supportive community, fostering resilience and compassion. MGMC's story is a testament to the transformative power of community-driven initiatives in even the most challenging environments..

Secretary Melissa Magstadt provided the opening remarks for the conference.

Classes included: best practices, ACS COT Update, Preparing for Disaster, Trauma Jeopardy, SD-VDRS and SUDORS Overview, EMS Updates, and Regional Performance Improvement Calls.







## National Traffic Incident Management Train-the-Trainer Course By Julie Smithson, Western EMS Specialist

The National TIM Responder Training Program was developed by responders for the responders, and was deigned to promote consistent training of all responders to achieve the three objectives of the TIM National Unified Goal (NUG):

- Responder Safety
- Safe, Quick Clearance
- Prompt, Reliable, Interoperable Communications

On August 24, 2023 in Ft. Pierre, 32 people from fire, law enforcement, emergency medical services, emergency management, towing, and transportation were trained as instructors in Traffic Incident Management (TIM). This was a joint project with the DOH EMS & Trauma, SD Dept. of Transportation, SD Highway Patrol, SD Fire Marshall, SD Emergency Managers, and Performance Towing and Recovery-Watertown.

Planning is currently taking place to schedule TIM classes throughout South Dakota in the near future.









# **Spearfish Public Access AED Units Project**

In 2023, the Spearfish Community Foundation launched a special project, in cooperation with the City of Spearfish and other local, community-minded organizations, to bring life-saving Automated External Defibrillator (AED) devices to the Spearfish community!



Spearfish Community Foundation has purchased five portable AED devices that are available for checkout (for registered special community events in Spearfish) at the Spearfish Recreation & Aquatics Center. AED smart cabinets and towers, complete with Stop the Bleed kits, will be installed throughout the city.

The all-weather, illuminated stations ensure lifesaving, portable devices are easily available, day or night, in high-traffic, public locations.

**Smart cabinets** housing life-saving Automated External Defibrillator (AED) devices and Stop the Bleed kits will be installed at strategic locations throughout the Spearfish community. Directional signage will indicate locations for pedestrians.

The **smart monitored cabinet** (towers or cabinets) ensures the presence and operating function of the AED while maintaining a climate controlled environment surrounding the defibrillator.

**Smart response technology** provides cellular, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and GPS wireless communication to 911 dispatchers, fire/EMS, and health care providers.

Additionally, transportable AED cases will be available at the Spearfish Rec and Aquatics Center to check-out for Spearfish community events.
