RE: Closure of Probation/License Returned to Active Unencumbered Status

Dear Lulu:

At the July 13, 2000 Board of Nursing meeting, the Board approved returning your licensed practical nurse license to an active unencumbered status based upon your completion of the Board ordered 18-month probation. This letter is written to document the Boards' decision. Your licensed practical nurse license has been returned to an active, unencumbered status as of the date listed above. A current licensed practical nurse renewal card is enclosed.

In the future, when you complete your South Dakota license renewal form, you must answer "yes" to the following question:

*Has your license or certification in any state or Canadian province been denied, revoked, suspended, stipulated, placed on probation or otherwise subjected to any type of disciplinary action?*

When answering "yes" to a question, you must explain the dates and circumstances on a separate piece of paper, which is submitted along with license renewal forms.

A letter will be written to both Lynne Kuper, RN, DNS at Covington Heights and Maggie Fink, BS, RNC, DNS at Sioux Falls Good Samaritan Village to inform them that you have completed your probation monitoring.

I discussed your request to have the Board consider granting you permission to write the NCLEX-RN with the Education Specialist. ARSD 20:48:03:06 Examination Results – Retaking Examination prohibits granting such a request. You were eligible to retake the examination a maximum of four times a year, during a three-year period. Because you first wrote the NCLEX-RN in 1987, your last opportunity to rewrite that exam would have been in 1990. You would now need to enroll in a nursing program and upon successful completion of the program, attempt to write the NCLEX-RN.

LuLu, on behalf of the Board of Nursing, I extend congratulations to you for completing probation monitoring. The Board wishes you continued success in your nursing practice. If you have any questions concerning this matter, feel free to contact me.
