At its regular meeting in Sioux Falls, SD on November 8, 2006 the South Dakota Board of Nursing considered your request for closure of your probation and release from mandated HPAP for both your Certified Nurse Practitioners license and your Registered Nurse license. Upon review of your file, the Board of Nursing by unanimous decision granted your request for closure of your probation and HPAP.

The South Dakota Board of Medical Examiners has also reviewed your case and they have also granted your request for closure of your probation and HPAP participation of you Certified Nurse Practitioners license.

Please be advised that having your license on "Probation" constitutes formal disciplinary action on your nursing license. You are required to answer "yes" to any questions, on the renewal application or any other licensure or employment applications, regarding a past history of having receiving disciplinary action by the Board of Nursing. Failure to answer "yes" to this type of question on any future application for licensure renewal will be considered a falsified application and will be reported to the Board of Nursing. Specifically, you must answer "yes" to the following question:

Has your license or certification in any state or Canadian province been denied, revoked, suspended, stipulated, placed on probation or otherwise subjected to any type of disciplinary action?

Enclosed you will find your current renewal certificate without "Probation" stamped on it. Please send back the renewal certificate stamped probation to the Board office upon receipt of this notice.
