About Cardiac Ready Programs



The Cardiac Ready Program focuses on educating, equipping, and empowering communities across South Dakota to be better prepared and more confident in helping somebody who is experiencing a cardiac event before the ambulance arrives, as well as promoting heart health in places of living, learning and work. The Cardiac Ready Program runs through a partnership of the SD Department of Health (DOH), South Dakota Foundation for Medical Care, and the Cardiovascular Collaborative, a voluntary group of SD medical and public health professionals working to improve the quality of life through the prevention and control of heart disease and stroke. Since 2017, the South Dakota Cardiovascular Collaborative has been working to improve the quality of life for all by preventing and managing cardiovascular disease and its associated risk factors. The Cardiovascular Collaborative focuses on advancing health equity, optimizing health through chronic disease prevention,

improving response to acute cardiovascular incidents, and supporting disease management.

In 2018, the Cardiovascular Collaborative initiated the Cardiac Ready Community Program, which creates a system of care prepared to help community members experiencing a cardiac event. The Cardiac Ready Program promotes the American Heart Association (AHA) Chain of Survival, which can improve the chances of survival and recovery for victims of cardiac events. This model is now expanded to include the Cardiac Ready Campus designation to promote heart health in South Dakota's post-secondary institutions such as trade schools, vocational schools, technical schools, colleges & universities.

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This renewal application is created for communities previously designated as Cardiac Ready Communities. After the first three years, the renewal application ensures continued commitment to cardiac emergency preparedness, public education, and heart health. Communities must demonstrate ongoing efforts, improvements, and sustainability across all categories. Once the renewal application is reviewed and approved, an additional three years of Cardiac Ready Community designation is awarded.

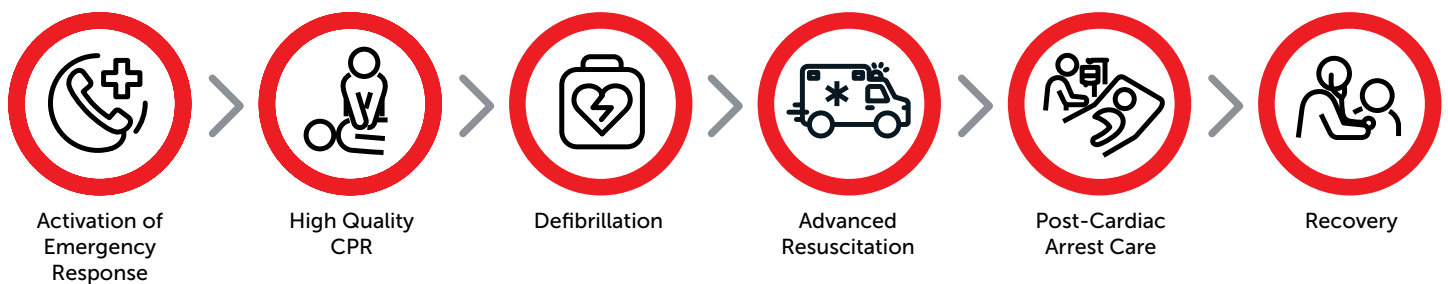

Focus Area 1 | Early Access to Emergency Care

Focus Area 2 | Early Defibrillation / AED Identification

The intention of this section is to ensure continued readiness and accessibility of AEDs throughout the community. Communities should look to maintain or expand their AED coverage. It's essential that all AEDS remain in an emergency-ready state through regular checks, maintenance, and documentation. Ongoing awareness of AED locations and regular training are key components of these continued efforts.

Renewal Requirements

Submit updated AED location list or map.

Provide current list/map of all AEDs including new placements sense designation.

Provide maintenance logs that document dates of routine checks, battery replacements, and pad expiration dates for each AED.

Show documentation that all law enforcement/fire/EMS organizations have access to AEDs.

Focus Area 3 | Early Advanced Cardiac Arrest Care & Post-Arrest Care

The intention of this section is to make sure communities maintain current EMS transport plans to support timely and efficient patient care. Ensure dispatcher T-CPR training remains current and continue to comply with EKG standards for patients with chest pain.

Renewal Requirements

Provide an updated transport plan.

Submit the most recent version of your transport plan, to ensure routes, facilities, and procedures are up to date.

Submit documentation of dispatcher training refreshers.

Show records verifying dispatchers have completed current T-CPR refresher training or continuing education within the past three years.

Provide confirmation that EKGs are completed for all patients presenting with chest pain.

Show documentation of established protocol and meeting quality standards.

Focus Area 4 | Community Heart Health

The intention of this section is to support ongoing efforts that improve overall heart health within the community. Communities are encouraged to continue or expand local health initiatives that promote wellness and prevention. Focusing on increasing access to screenings, encouraging healthy living, and supporting tobacco initiatives. In addition, communities should maintain or update AED ordinances.

Renewal Requirements

Provide an updated list of healthy eating initiatives and physical activity programs.

Include documentation of any current or new community health activities, such as event flyers, participation numbers, or success stories that highlight local impact

Focus Area 5 | Sustainability Plan

Renewal Requirements

Submit updated CPR/AED training and AED placement plans.

Submit documentation showing community CPR training/class schedules, AED locations, or any updates to keep AEDs and training current.
