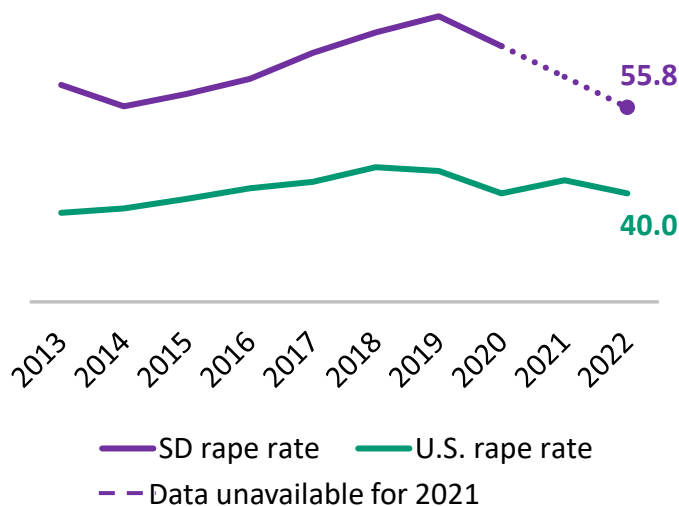
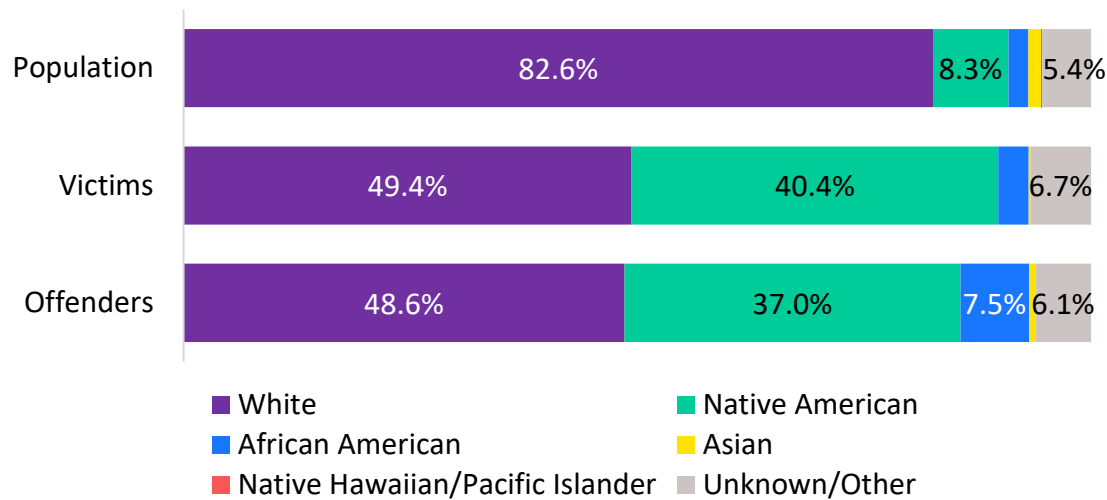


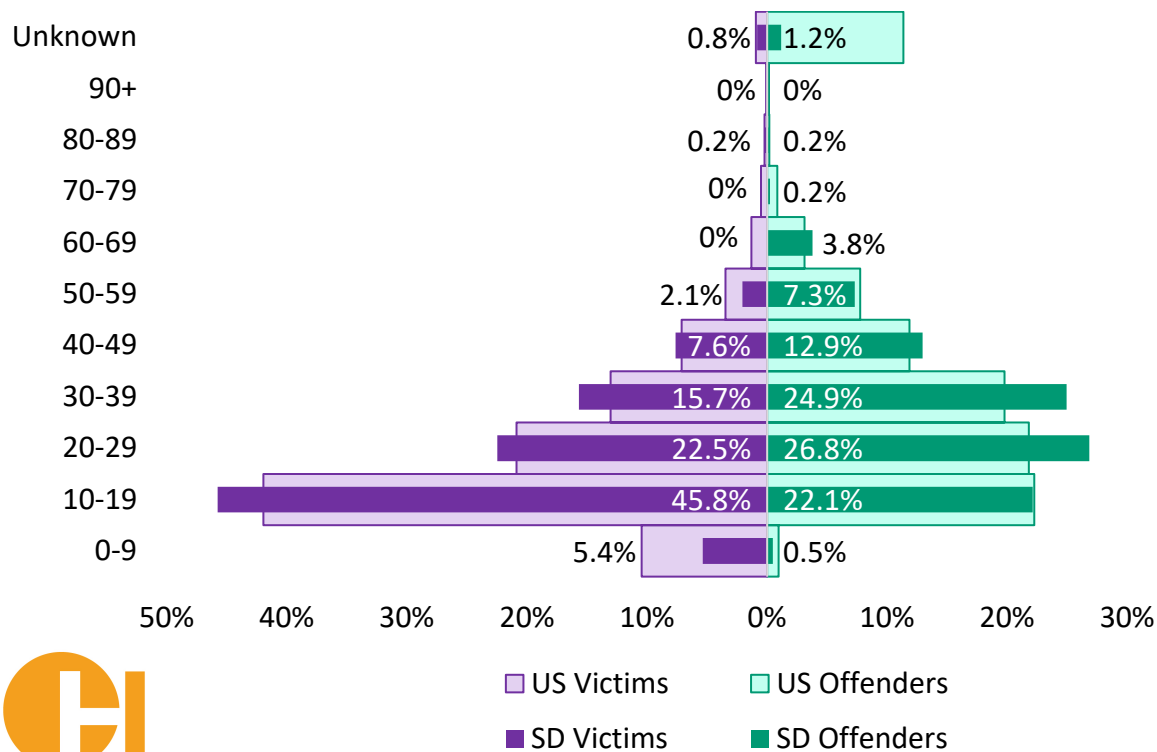
SD & U.S. Rape Rates (per 100,000)¹

SD & U.S. Age Distribution of Victims & Offenders²



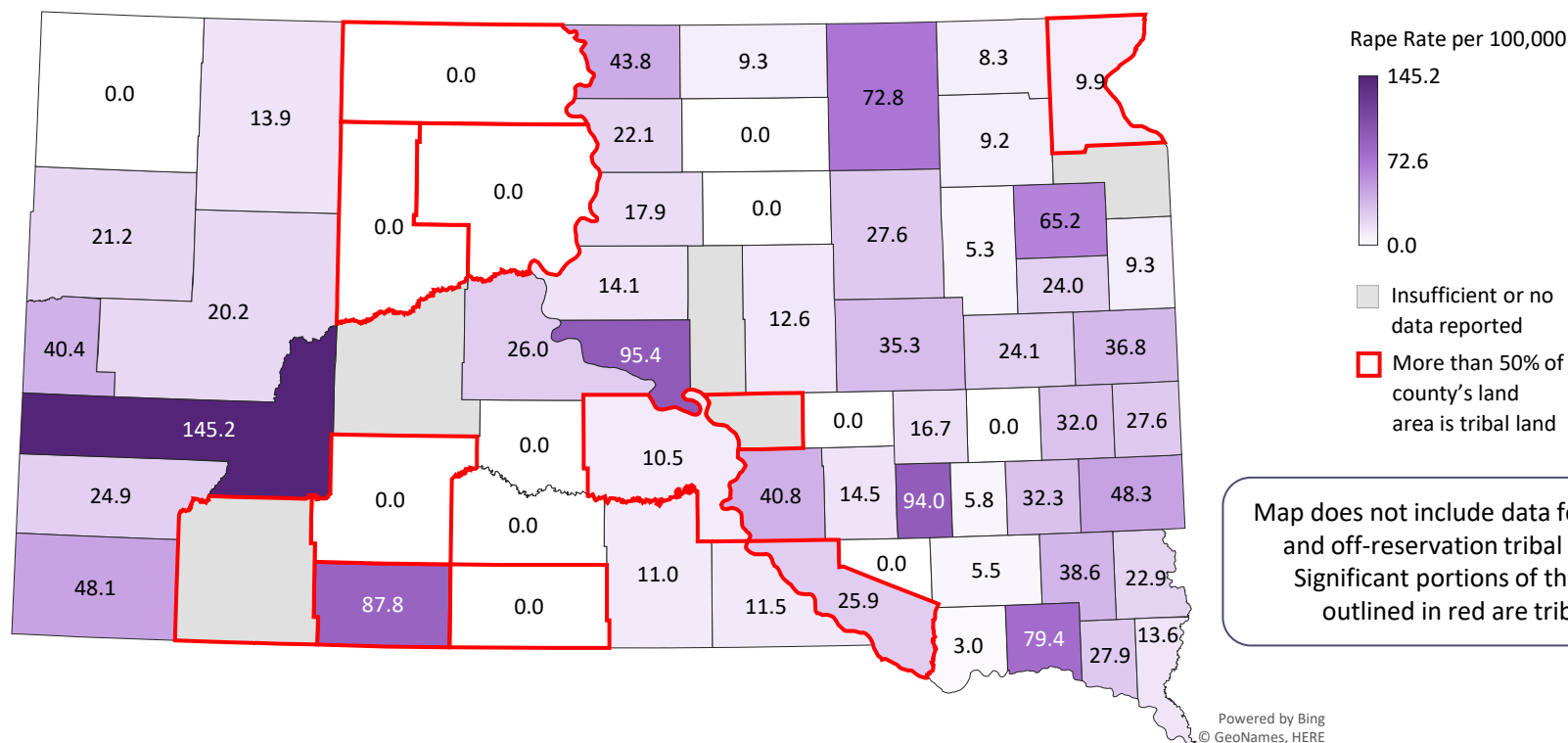
KEY TAKEAWAYS

- ❖ SD's rape rate continues to be higher than the U.S. rape rate but has been decreasing since 2019.
- ❖ SD rape rate is 10th highest in the nation in 2022.¹
- ❖ Rapid City has the 7th highest rape rate (107.1 per 100,000) in the nation per metropolitan areas in the U.S.¹
- ❖ The Native American population is disproportionately overrepresented among rape victims and offenders.
- ❖ About half (51.2%) of SD rape victims are under the age of 20.
- ❖ About half (49.4%) of SD rape offenders are under the age of 30.
