What is it?

Severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) is caused by SARS-associated coronavirus (SARS-CoV).

What are symptoms of SARS?

Those with SARS typically experience a high fever first, and additional symptoms can include headaches, feelings of discomfort, body aches and mild respiratory symptoms. Patients may experience dry coughing and are likely to develop pneumonia.

How does SARS spread?

SARS is thought to spread through contact with infected people and especially through particles from sneezing and coughing. It may also spread when people touch infected surfaces or be airborne.

Can it be prevented?

If you or someone you know may have SARS, contact your health care provider and ensure to call ahead of time before meeting with any medical professionals.
