What is SD-VDRS?

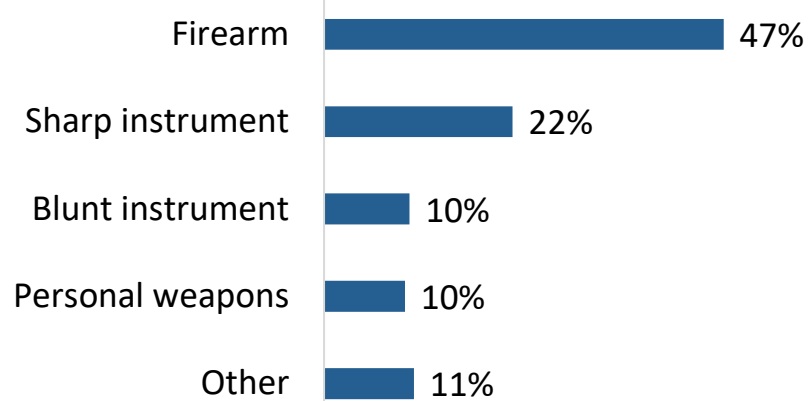
The South Dakota Violent Death Reporting System (SD-VDRS) is a CDC-funded state surveillance system that collects information on suicides, homicides, undetermined deaths, unintentional firearm deaths, and legal intervention deaths that occur in the state.

Homicide Deaths by Year

43 in 2021
53 in 2022
39 in 2023

47% of homicide deaths were firearm-related

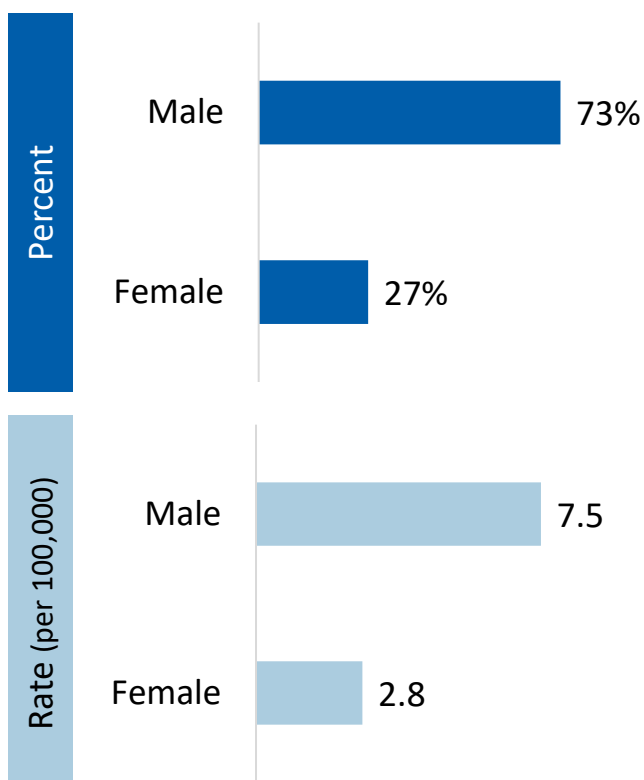


Homicide deaths were most often preceded by:

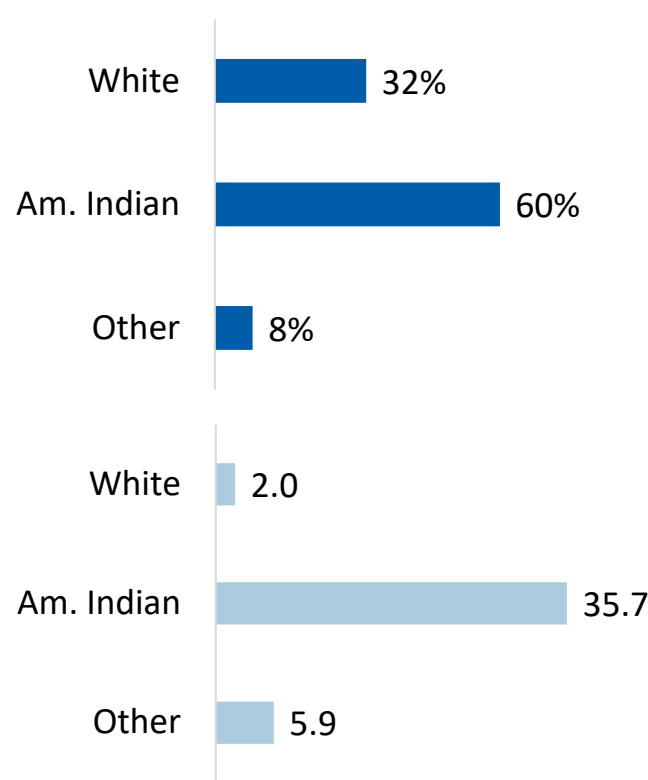
- Arguments (before or during incident)
- Another crime
- Intimate partner problem
- Physical fights

Circumstances are documented by coroners and/or law enforcement.

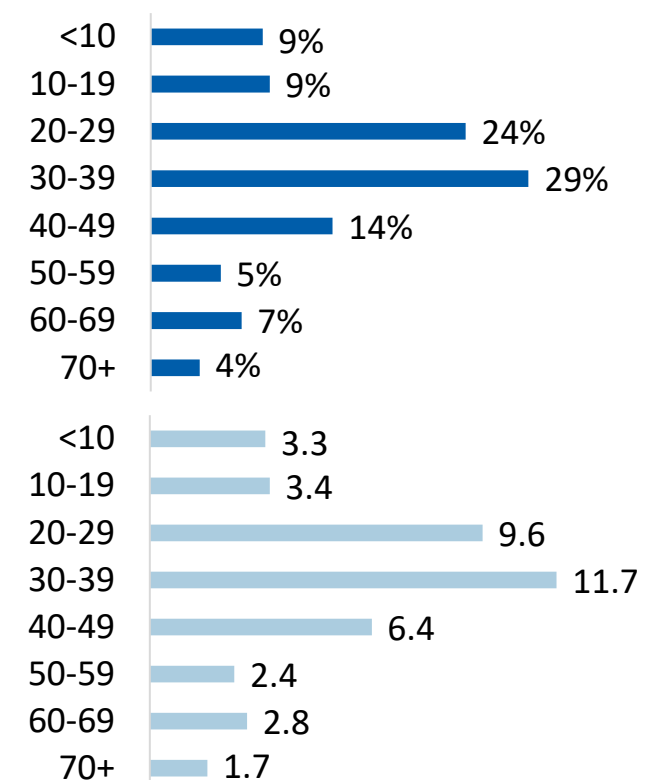
Homicide Deaths by Sex

Homicide Deaths by Age Group

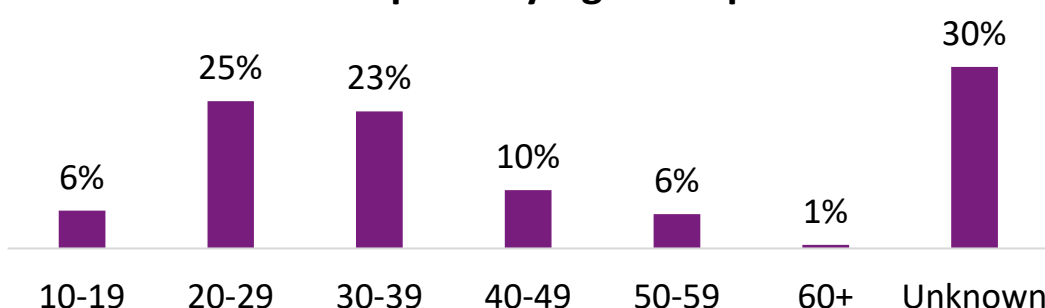


Homicide Suspect Information

Homicide Suspect Demographics

- Most suspects were male
- Most suspects were between the ages 20-39 years

Suspects by Age Group



Most homicide suspects knew their victim

- 51% of suspects knew their victim
- 9% of suspects were a stranger to the victim
- 40% of suspect/victim relationships were unknown

Homicide suspects often had:

- Contact with law enforcement within the past 12 months
- Suspected substance use in the hours preceding the incident
- Suspected alcohol use in the hours preceding the incident
