
PHYSICAL, MENTAL, OR EMOTIONAL DISABILITY

Prevalence of Physical, Mental, or Emotional Disability




DISABILITY WITH SPECIAL EQUIPMENT NEEDED

Prevalence of Disability with Special Equipment Needed


